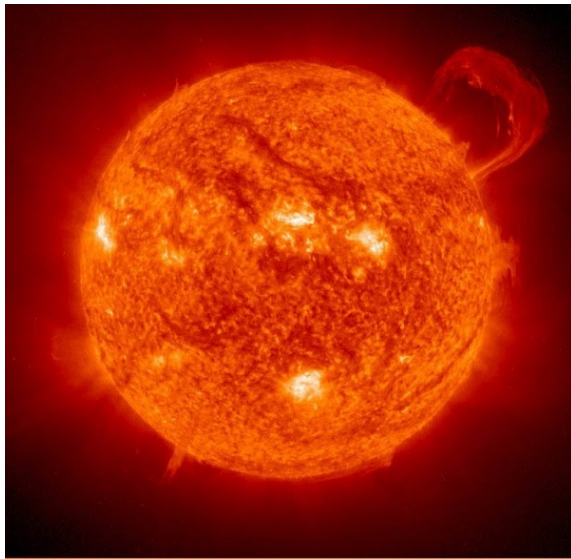

# Food Web Poster Instructions

1. Your poster should be divided into 3 sections *(Su póster debe dividirse en 3 secciones.)*
2. Each section should have it's own label: Producer, Consumer, or Decomposer. *(Cada sección debe tener su propia etiqueta: Productor, Consumidor o Descomponedor.)*
3. Decomposers must be at the bottom, producers in the middle, and consumers at the top. Write the definition of each along with the word. *(Los descomponedores deben estar en la parte inferior, los productores en el medio y los consumidores en la parte superior. Escriba la definición de cada uno junto con la palabra.)*
4. Each section needs to have 4 photos. You will not use ALL the photos- that's okay! *(Cada sección debe tener 4 fotos. No usarás TODAS las fotos, ¡está bien!)*
5. Each photo should have an arrow connecting it to at least one other photo. Label the arrows one of two ways *(Cada foto debe tener una flecha que la conecte al menos a una foto otra. Rotula las flechas de dos maneras):*
  - a. Eats *(comen)*
  - b. Decomposes *(descomponen)*

## Tips & Tricks:

- Start by cutting out & dividing your photos: which ones are producers? Which ones are consumers? Which ones are decomposers? *(Comience recortando y dividiendo sus fotos: ¿cuáles son los productores? ¿Cuáles son los consumidores? ¿Cuáles son los descomponedores?)*
- Lay out all of your photos before gluing and drawing arrows. This will help you decide where to put them! *(Diseña todas tus fotos antes de pegar y dibujar flechas. ¡Esto te ayudará a decidir dónde colocarlos!)*
- Feel free to get creative! *(¡Sientete libre de ser creativo!)*

# Consumers

**An organism that can't make its own food, and which has to “consume” (eat!) other organisms to survive.**

Some consumers are “herbivores,” which means they eat only plants (like rabbits). Some consumers are “carnivores,” these are animals that eat only other animals (like lions). Some consumers are “omnivores,” which means they eat both plants and animals (like humans!).

# Producers

**Producers are organisms that “produce” (make!) their own food.**

Plants are producers because they make their own food with the help of the sun through a process called “photosynthesis.”

---

# Decomposers

**An organism that primarily feeds on dead organisms or the waste from living organisms.**

Decomposers are like the garbage men of the animal & plant kingdom! They take all the dead animals and plants (consumers and producers) and break them down into their nutrient components so that plants can use them to make more food.



# Consumidores

**Un organismo que no puede producir su propio alimento y que tiene que "consumir" (¡comer!) Otros organismos para sobrevivir.**

Algunos consumidores son "herbívoros", lo que significa que solo comen plantas (como conejos). Algunos consumidores son "carnívoros", estos son animales que solo comen otros animales (como los leones). Algunos consumidores son "omnívoros", lo que significa que comen plantas y animales (¡como los humanos!)

# Productores

**Los productores son organismos que "producen" (¡hacen!) sus propios alimentos.**

Las plantas son productoras porque hacen su propia comida con la ayuda del sol a través de un proceso llamado "fotosíntesis".

# Descomponedores

**Un organismo que se alimenta principalmente de organismos muertos o de los desechos de organismos vivos.**

¡Los descomponedores son como los basureros del reino animal y vegetal! Toman todos los animales y plantas muertos (consumidores y productores) y los descomponen en sus componentes nutritivos para que las plantas puedan usarlos para producir más alimentos.
